Who attends the Conference?

CCSA's conference is attended by people from a range of children's services including preschools, long day care, occasional care, mobiles, family day care, out of school hours care, early intervention and multipurpose services.

Participants include early childhood teachers, directors, coordinators, child care workers, management committee and board members, service owners and administrators as well as providers of support services such as children's services advisers, representatives from peak organisations and policy makers.

Where is next year's Conference?

The 2005 conference will be held at City Hall Newcastle. Opened in 1929, City Hall is one of Newcastle's most unique and prestigious venues offering old world charm with state of the art facilities.
