**Length of Paper:** This Call for Papers is to solicit papers for a 30 or 45 minute presentation time (including discussion time) and poster/visual presentations. The Conference Committee may select papers according to whether they fit the Conference theme, and presentations will be organised into the proposed themes as outlined overleaf & below (**please tick the appropriate boxes under both 1 & 2**).

**Deadline:** Proposals must be submitted by **18 February 2005**.

#### Abstract

A 100-200 word abstract is required, which should include the following:

- Statement of the issue to be addressed and a clear rationale for its relevance to the Conference theme.
- Clearly stated objective for the session/your presentation
- Clear statement of how the objective will be addressed, eg. through presentation of research data, review of literature, description of community project, visual etc.
- Implications for policy and practice.
